Also, there is even UA Connect, a SEN and Autism-friendly session which runs twice a week.


Urban Air also features LoudLounge sessions on a Friday night where you can bounce around to some classic hits from UA's very own resident DJ!

£200 million regeneration planned for Winsford

insford could be set to benefit from a £200 million regeneration after Cheshire West and Chester Council (CWAC) unveiled a proposal to enhance economic opportunities in the town.

The 'Winsford Regeneration Programme' will be resourced over the next two years with £3.5 million from the Councils' Capital programme and will bring a whole host of positive developments to Winsford.

Following the 'Whole Place' approach, the scheme will focus on four key areas including regeneration, improving education, skills and employment opportunities and providing early intervention and support for vulnerable adults, families and children.

The council will also work on a number of schemes to make Winsford a more integrated place to live, work and socialise.

Plans are in place to develop the Waterfront to include restaurants, boating and the provision of walking and cycling, and they're working closely with the Town Council too to reinforce Town Park and the High Street.

There will be new and improved parking spaces, links between the Town Centre and the Waterfront and additional investment will re-establish the High Street as a highly visible, accessible location for independent businesses to grow and flourish.

Winsford 1-5 Industrial Estate has also been earmarked for investment and expansion as outlined in the Winsford Neighbourhood Plan.

The plan identifies 30ha of employment land for development and when completed, the site could provide more than 1 million square feet of employment floor space, creating approximately 2,000 jobs and attracting up to £90 million of investment.

This will be complemented by an in-depth transport strategy, advice and guidance for young people with relation to careers and also a new Work Zone for people seeking employment.

Add to this the plan to improve support for vulnerable adults, families and children and the regeneration programme really is a detailed, comprehensive proposal which could revolutionise the social, economic and cultural landscape of Winsford.

Councillor Brian Clarke, Cabinet Member for Economic Development and Infrastructure believes the programme will really give Winsford a boost.

"This ambitious programme is completely in line with the aims of the nationally recognised Winsford Neighbourhood Plan.

"Our plans include new jobs and improved leisure facilities for residents plus news homes while also helping tackle inequality and making Winsford a place where everyone can really thrive."

If the apprentices impress there is every chance that they will go on to secure permanent jobs too, which in turn will have a positive effect on the local economy.


Estate Manager Louise Ashley is delighted that job and apprentice opportunities are constantly being created and has praised the businesses on the Estate.

Plans under way to alleviate parking concerns

oncerns have been raised regarding parking on the estate and the health and safety problems that have come with it.

As a result, the Executive Board have been working hard to address and tackle the problem.

In recent months, they've met with Cheshire West and Chester Council (CWAC), representatives from Highways and also the Police to help resolve the issues.

Following these meetings, temporary traffic regulation orders were hoped to be put in place and a consultation was held with businesses on the estate.

Proposed restrictions include double yellow lines, no stopping zones and also signs stating that there can be no overnight parking and businesses were all invited to state where they would like to see the orders imposed.

This has now been sent to the Council to begin the official process.

Through excellent partnership working between the BID and CWAC, a toilet Facility on Road

5 has been provided and leaflets have been produced in Polish for many of the truck drivers who take goods to and from the estate.

It is hoped these new facilities and informational documents will substantially reduce problems that had been arising with regards to parking and Health & Safety.
