BID 3 paves the way for £500k estate investment

A big thank you to all the businesses on the estate who voted YES to the Business Improvement District (BID) proposal.

The vote was an overwhelming YES with around 90 per cent of businesses approving the latest BID.

This now paves the way for a third term of the BID and brings a further five years of investment worth more than £500,000 to improve the estate.

Improvements will include:

- **Enhanced security and CCTV** systems
- Landscape upgrades
- A range of business support services such as a dedicated Estate Manager

The BID has been developed and managed by Groundwork since 2006.

Jane Hough, Business Improvement District Manager Groundwork,

Lancashire and Merseyside, said: "This will see over £500k of private sector led investment delivered to support businesses/organisations across estate over the next 5 years.

The result demonstrates a very strong mandate of support for the Estate and I would like to thank you all for your support."

The Winsford BID, which started in 2006 and will now run until 2021, is the UK's longest running non-retail BID.

Thank you to all the businesses who attended the Winsford Transport Strategy consultation which was kindly hosted at H&M Hennes, on Road One.

The event gave companies on the estate the opportunity to give their views about transport issues affecting road, rail, buses and cycling.

Mott McDonald (Transport Consultants appointed by Cheshire West and Chester Council) held the consultation and are collating views from across the community about the town's future transport needs.

Initial finding are still being studied but general views included:

- The need for better access to the M6.
- Concern over reduction in bus provision and lack of connectivity to Northwich.
- Congestion and heavy traffic flows through Winsford.
- The need to improve the town centre.
- The need for better cycling infrastructure.

The final strategy is expected to be completed by March 2016.
