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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR



Hello and welcome to the Winsford 1-5 autumn newsletter.

I hope you've all had a positive summer despite the lack of sun – I can't quite believe we're in October already!

I'd like to start with some good news, and I'm pleased to report that the final phase expansion of the Winsford 1-5 CCTV system is now complete.

The decision to fully upgrade the CCTV/ANPR system was taken with the security of our businesses and their employees at the forefront of the board's mind, and we're delighted that OneTek have now finished the scheme.

Utilising the latest in AI enabled detection technology, the system comprises **40 cameras** – with **two dedicated ANPR cameras** – which capture nearly **29,000 hours** of coverage every 30 days.

Perhaps most impressively, AI assists dedicated monitoring by highlighting key objects, such as people and vehicles, allowing the operators to quickly review footage to recover critical evidence.

On top of this, detailed meta data allows the BID to understand the movement of people and vehicles around the estate. This information can then be used to create models for other key metrics such as economic performance and carbon output.

One significant piece of data we have already noted for instance, is that from 24th August to 24th September this year, there were **472,240 DVLA matched registration plates** moving through the ANPR cameras. For the same period in 2022 there were **336,634**. We can therefore see that the estate is busier this year which will have a direct correlation with economic output from that activity.

We can also measure estimated CO2 emissions from vehicles which will help shape our net zero plans going forward.

Overall it is a great boost for the estate and will deliver many benefits over the coming months and years.

NEW PLANS REVEALED FOR WINSFORD GATEWAY

Plans for a 225,075 sq ft logistics unit at Winsford Gateway have been brought forward by Doncasterbased Rula Developments.

An application has been submitted to Cheshire West and Chester Council for the scheme, which proposes to provide 213,159 sq ft of warehousing space alongside 11,916 sq ft of office accommodation, with flexibility to expand on the prominent 12.6-acre plot.

With capacity to support around 275 full time jobs, the building design also incorporates the highest sustainability credentials with EPC A and BREEAM Excellent ratings.



Subject to planning consent, construction could begin as soon as March 2024, with a fast-track delivery programme allowing occupation by September 2024. In May, Rula also submitted applications to speculatively deliver two smaller industrial units offering 74,508 sq ft and 27,728 sq ft of accommodation.



MITRAS RAISE THOUSANDS THROUGH FOOTBALL DAY

SUCCESSFUL YEAR FOR SAINT FLOORING

It has been a successful year for Saint Flooring after the company revealed that up until the year ending 31st January 2023, the business turned over £21 million with a pre-tax profit of £3.9 million.

Writing in a report alongside the financial results, the business said that its sales growth indicated "real momentum" with a "real appetite to drive the business forward."

The report added: "Despite an uncertain economic landscape, driven by inflation and rising interest rates, we fully expect the business to continue an upward trajectory and record growth in the year ended 31st January 2024."

Saint Flooring was established by Steve Turner in 2008, and is now based at Pineapple Park here on Winsford Industrial Estate.

BOARD MEETS WITH LOCAL MP

In September the Winsford 1–5 Chair Pete Price, BID board member Darren Aley and BID manager Hugh Shields, had a meeting with local MP Rt Hon Edward Timpson. He was invited to discuss the new legislation that was discussed in parliament regarding encampments on industrial sites and business parks in Cheshire. The Chair wanted the MP to understand the continued incursions that Winsford endures and the problems that it brings to the estate and businesses. The BID board have also had meetings with the Police Crime Commissioner and local police officers regarding these matters. It is hoped that the new legislation, which has been significantly amended, will give the police expanded powers in relation to unauthorised encampments.
