BUSINESS SECURITY PROTOCOLS TESTED BY LOCAL POLICE

To help businesses improve their safety and security protocols, Cheshire Police recently asked companies based on Winsford 1-5 if they would like to volunteer in covert security testing on their premises.

13 different businesses took part in the process, with two plainclothes officers posing as inspectors and attempting to access secure areas.

We're pleased to reveal that seven businesses passed by preventing or challenging entry, and one did stop the officers but allowed access.

Five of the participating organisations failed the challenge however, allowing the officers access, in one case for 40 minutes.

Those with security gaps were notified and will now receive assessments and recommendations from the police in order to help them improve their safety measures and address vulnerabilities.

Additional testing is likely to take place in the coming months.

The end goal of the program is to boost local business recycling rates and help to protect the environment by reducing waste.
