TIGER TRAILERS ARE TAKING THE BISCUIT

Another fleet of vehicles produced by Tiger Trailers for a high-profile customer have hit the roads.



Fox's Burton's Companies – which produces well-known treats including Maryland Cookies, Jammie Dodgers, and Party Rings – have welcomed nineteen moving deck double decks and two single deck box vans created by the Winsford based company.

The biscuit manufacturer's new double decks are powered by Tiger's own four-ram hydraulic lifting system and have been designed and engineered in a wedge iteration to enable them to transport a capacity of fifty-two UK pallets. This maximises utilisation efficiency and reduces both carbon dioxide emissions and fuel spend.

Safety was also at the forefront of the delivered specification, with the vehicles featuring safe parking systems, infrastructure to protect against finger injuries, Anchorlock to mitigate trailer runaways, and a flashing warning lamp to warn cyclists of each trailer's danger zones.

Speaking about the project, **Thomas Stott**, Key Account Manager at Tiger Trailers, said:



It's been a pleasure collaborating closely with the Logistics team from FBC while working on these exciting new trailers. Our businesses share a desire for high quality, and it's great to see a customer taking safety so seriously as seen in the specification of their new trailers.

It's great each time we see one of FBC's new Tiger trailers out there delivering confectionaries everyone is familiar with, and we look forward to continuing to support their operations over the coming months and years.

The new vehicles will operate out of FBC's sites in Batley, West Yorkshire, and Kirkham in Lancashire.

EVENT HELD TO MARKSUSTAINABILITY SUCCESSES

An event was held earlier this year to celebrate the sustainability endeavours of a range of businesses across Gadbrook Park, Winsford 1-5, and the West Chester Commercial BID.

Held by Groundwork and hosted at Cheshire West and Chester Council's Business Support Hub in Winsford, the event marked the conclusion of the organisation's low carbon mentoring programme which has seen businesses in Cheshire undertaking 'Pathways to Net Zero' training.

The initiative was designed to provide organisations with guidance on best practices for tackling the climate crisis, and offers ongoing learning provision to support companies in helping them reduce their carbon footprint.

Andrew Cooper MP attended the event to present certificates to participating businesses and commended those involved for their commitment to environmental sustainability.

On the day there was also chance to shine a spotlight on Groundwork's contributions to the UK Shared Prosperity Fund decarbonisation project. As part of this initiative, Groundwork has facilitated a reduction of over 200 tonnes of CO2 emissions. **Greville Kelly**, Director for Business at Groundwork, commented:

BID SHARES VEHICLE TRAFFIC DATA

The BID board is pleased to share our smart place report which follows on from the significant upgrade to the estate's CCTV system which took place last year.

The investment saw **the number of cameras increase from five to 40**, enabling the BID team to address numerous security blind spots across the estate.

Thanks to the extended camera coverage, we are now able to distribute traffic figures from data gathered between April 2024 to January 2025.

The BID team continuously monitors crime statistics to ensure the safety and security of our business environment. In line with this, we're pleased to share that our analysis of UK crime statistics reveals a positive trend in our estate's safety, with the total number of reported crimes decreasing by 32% compared to the previous year. This reduction reflects the ongoing collaborative efforts highlighted in our monthly security meetings, and the BID's commitment to maintaining a safe business environment.

FACTORY TO CLOSE

Schoeller Allibert will be closing its Winsford factory here on the estate in June. The decision to shut the facility, which manufactures reusable packaging for use in the logistics industry, has been taken as part of the firm's plans to consolidate its manufacturing footprint in Europe.

LOCAL COLLEGE PRAISED

Warrington & Vale Royal College, which has a campus in Winsford, has received impressive marks in its recent Ofsted inspection.
